REMINDER OF DATA CALL INFORMATION DUE

TO: All Insurers Licensed to Transact Insurance Business within the State of South Carolina

RE: Reminder of Data Call Information Due

DATE: August 25, 2025

South Carolina law gives the director or his designee the authority to require any authorized insurer or its officers to answer any inquiry in relation to its transactions, condition, or any connected matter necessary to the administration of the insurance laws of the state. It also gives the director or his designee the authority to require any authorized insurer or its officers to answer any inquiry in relation to its transactions, financial condition, or any connected matter necessary to the administration of the insurance laws of the state. In accordance with South Carolina Code of Laws Section 38-13-160, the South Carolina Department of Insurance will be issuing two data calls next month. This document serves as advance notice regarding those two data calls.

On May 30, 2025, an advance notice of coming data calls was issued advising that two data calls were to be issued. These data calls were issued on July 1, 2025 with a response due by August 31, 2025. This is a reminder that the data call information will soon be due. Both data calls require a zero report if companies do not offer the coverage.

Any insurer licensed to sell life insurance and/or disability income insurance in South Carolina who has a Family Leave insurance product must comply with this data call. The Paid Family Leave Data Call can be found [here](#).

For the past two years, the Department has issued a Liability data call requesting information on certain Liability lines of business. However, this year the data call will be different. Pursuant to SC [Bill H3430](#), Chapter 73, Title 38 of the S.C. Code is amended by adding Section [38-73-550](#) which requires preparation of an annual report on the status of the Commercial General Liability and Liquor Liability markets. The information should be provided for the last ten (10) calendar/accident years, broken down by each calendar/accident year, with the data valued as of December 31st, 2024. For clarification, the term calendar/accident year means calendar year policy counts and earned premiums, and accident year loss amounts and claim counts. Failure of an insurer to respond timely or failure of an insurer to provide accurate and useable data will result in referral for violation of SC Code of Laws Section 38-5-130. The insurer will be subject to fines and/or the potential for a market conduct exam.

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
